ABSENT

WHEREAS, Surry County needs and desires to install and maintain certain infrastructure including water and sewer lines, storm drainage, entrances, etc. within the right of way owned by the Virginia Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Transportation needs to be assured that the installation and maintenance of said infrastructure items does not disrupt or destroy the road surfaces and right of way owned and maintained by the Virginia Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Virginia Department of Transportation desires that a resolution be adopted by the Surry County Board of Supervisors providing assurance that should the County installation and maintenance cause damage to the right of way or road surface, the County will provide either the required repairs to said damage or provide the funding for the Virginia Department of Transportation to have such repairs made.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT the Board of Supervisors of Surry County will indemnify and save harmless the Virginia Department of Transportation from any expense, damage or injury which the Virginia Department of Transportation may sustain growing out of the granting to said County by the Virginia Department of Transportation of said permits for such work. Be it further resolved that if said County shall let to contract any works as foresaid, the contractor shall be required before commencing such work to furnish the Virginia Department of Transportation and indemnifying bond with approved surety in the amount of **FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$50,000)**.
