Background of CSA

Through Virginia's Comprehensive Services Act (CSA), the 1992 General Assembly established one of the nation's first comprehensive systems of care for at-risk children. The system was put in place to provide treatment services for children who exhibit serious emotional and behavioral problems.

Eligibility for CSA Services:

- Child or Youth requires placement for purposes of special education in approved private school educational programs. § 2.2-5210A3
- The child or youth requires foster care services as defined in § 63.2-905
- Eligibility is determined by various laws and by the Community Policy and Management Team and the availability of funds.
- All other resources must be exhausted before using CSA funds.
- Co-payments may be required by families upon financial assessment.

Our Program

WHAT IS CSA?

The Children's Services Act (CSA) is a law enacted in 1993 that establishes a single state pool of funds to purchase services for at-risk youth and their families. The state funds, combined with local community funds, are managed by local interagency teams who plan and oversee services to youth.

Mission Statement

The mission of the Surry County CSA is to create a collaborative system of services and funding that is child-centered, family-focused, and community-based when addressing the strengths and needs of troubled and at-risk youth and their families § 2.2-5200 in the Commonwealth.



CSA at Work:

- A meeting is scheduled with the family of the youth and the Family Assessment Planning Team to encourage involvement of the family in assessing the strengths and needs of the youth.
- Then a service plan is developed to meet the identified needs.

Goals & Objectives

Goal 1- To provide youth and their families with appropriate services by protecting the welfare of the youth.

(to maintain youth and public safety)

Objective- To provide appropriate care through services that meet the individual needs of each youth.

Goal 2 -To involve parents with their children's plan from the beginning of seeking services.

Objective- To organize strategies and activities that will increase the public's awareness about the important role of parents involvement in every aspect of their youth's lives.

Goal 3- To improve the quality of parenting.

Objective- To offer services when deemed necessary to assist parents with in home services, parenting skills, and other services for a holistic plan for their youth's future.

Goal 4- To provide a means for youth who are unable to remain in the school atmosphere with education in safe environments.

Objective-To seek vendors who are licensed and accredited to serve our youth.

Unique Aspect

This program is coordinated by the Surry County Department of Youth and Family Resources. It is advised and implemented by OCS, the Office of Children's Services.
